1. The title of this operations plan is 316 AD OPLAN 316-12. Ramstein Open House FLUGTAG. This plan supersedes 316 AD OPLAN 316-12, dated 15 July 1987.
2. This document is UNCLASSIFIED and does not come within the scope of directives governing the protection of information affecting the national security.
3. This operations plan outlines areas of responsibility for organizations participating in the Ramstein Open House FLUGTAG.
4. Tasked organizations will prepare internal operating procedures to execute tasks outlined in this OPLAN. Extract portions of this OPLAN and its annexes thereto to satisfy this requirement.
5. Forward recommended changes to this OPLAN to 316 AD/CV.

PLAN SUMMARY

1. PURPOSE: This OPLAN outlines the responsibilities and tasks assigned to the various 316 Air Division (316 AD) agencies involved in making the Ramstein Open House FLUGTAG a highly successful event.
2. CONDITIONS FOR EXECUTION: Execute this plan as soon as HQ USAF approves the date for the Ramstein Open House FLUGTAG, based upon an anticipated stable politico-military situation.
3. DEFINITION: F-Day - The scheduled date of the Ramstein Open House FLUGTAG.
4. OPERATIONS TO BE CONDUCTED:
  - a. Deployment. The 86 TFW will receive and beddown static displays (aircraft; land-based weapons systems and equipment) and aerial demonstration aircraft from other US units and allied nations.
  - b. Employment. On F-Day, at 0600Z, the Ramstein Air Base gates will open to the public. Expect a minimum of 250,000 visitors. During the afternoon of F-Day, the aerial demonstrations will participate in an airshow for the enjoyment of our guests.
  - c. Tasked Organizations. Refer to ANNEX A.
  - d. Supporting Plans. Tasked organizations will prepare implementing instructions. Extract portions of this OPLAN for that purpose.
5. KEY ASSUMPTIONS:
  - a. The 316 AD will not be required to cancel the Ramstein Open House FLUGTAG because of events beyond its control.
  - b. The 316 AD will request and provide sufficient aircraft and land-based weapons systems and equipment for static displays, and aircraft, aircrew, and parachutists for aerial demonstrations.
6. TIMES TO COMMENCE EFFECTIVE OPERATIONS: In most cases, F-Day will take place on a given Sunday during June, July, August, or September.
  - a. F-Day - 2 - Static displays and aerial demonstrations begin to arrive.
  - b. F-Day - 1 - Static displays and aerial demonstrations should arrive NLT 1400Z.
  - c. F-Day - 1 0800Z - Briefing for aerial demonstration aircrews (512 TFS main briefing room).
  - d. F-Day - 1 1100Z - Aerial demonstrations practice period begins. Ends at 1500Z.
  - e. F-Day 0600Z - Ramstein Open House FLUGTAG begins. Gates open.
  - f. F-Day 0700Z - Remote controlled aircraft demonstrations. Ends by 1000Z.
  - g. F-Day 0730Z - Safety/Flying Operations Briefings (Hangar B).
  - h. F-Day 0930Z - 316 AD Commander's DV Reception (Base Operations/Tower, Building 2303).
  - i. F-Day 1100Z - Airshow begins.
  - j. F-Day 1500Z - Ramstein Open House FLUGTAG ends. Cleanup begins.
  - k. F-Day 1700Z - 316 AD Commander's FLUGTAG Participants Reception (Ramstein Officers' Club).  
1800Z - Presentations to FLUGTAG aerial demonstration participants.
  - l. F-Day + 1 - Static displays and aerial demonstrations depart.
7. COMMAND RELATIONSHIPS: The 316 AD Commander is responsible for the conduct of the Ramstein Open House FLUGTAG. The 86 TFW Command Post, Building 2201, is the command center for this event. 316 AD will establish additional subordinate command centers, as necessary.
8. LOGISTIC APPRAISAL: The 316 AD can logistically support this plan within normal limitations.
9. PERSONNEL APPRAISAL: The 316 AD will need augmentation of its security forces for security, traffic, and crowd control.

APPENDIX 4 TO ANNEX 5 TO 316 AD OPLAN 316-12  
DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

1. MISSION: Provide disaster preparedness support for the Ramstein Open House FLUGTAG.

2. EXECUTION:

a. The Chief of the Disaster Preparedness Branch (377 CSW/AOD) will:

- (1) Appoint a FLUGTAG disaster preparedness project officer/coordinator.
- (2) Provide an escort officer for the German Disaster Preparedness representative in the SRC, if required.

b. The FLUGTAG disaster preparedness project officer/coordinator (377 CSW/AOD) will:

- (1) Coordinate for the activation and manning of the Survival Recovery Center (SRC).
- (2) Situate a mobile command post to a location from which it can rapidly respond.
- (3) Detail one individual to the German Disaster Preparedness Center in Kindsbach, if required.
- (4) Form the Disaster Response Force at the alternate location (Bldg 516) should an off-base response be required.

APPENDIX 5 TO ANNEX 5 TO 316 AD OPLAN 316-12  
EOD SUPPORT

1. MISSION: Provide EOD support for the Ramstein Open House FLUGTAG.
2. EXECUTION:
- a. The Commander of the 7006 Explosive Ordnance Disposal Flight (7006 EOD/CC) will:
    - (1) Appoint a FLUGTAG EOD project officer/coordinator.
    - (2) Provide 2 EOD teams with a total of six EOD technicians (464X0).
      - (a) One improvised explosive device (IED) response team.
      - (b) One aircraft crash response team.
  - b. Duty times. Both teams will be available on Ramstein Air Base from 0600Z to 1800Z, F-Day.
  - c. Location.
    - (1) The IED response team - building 2201, 316 AD headquarters.
    - (2) The crash response team - at the intersection of taxiways one (1) and six (6).
  - d. Equipment.
    - (1) Teams will have necessary tools and equipment to perform their specific tasks.
    - (2) Two radios per team to monitor the crash and security police nets for emergency response.
  - e. Explosive device response. If an explosive device is found, an IED response team will take appropriate actions.
  - f. Aircraft crash response. If an aircraft crash occurs, the EOD crash response team will respond with the initial response team.
